Cpl. Nibert also talked to residents about personal safety tips.

- Carry a cell phone with you.↓
- If possible, **do not walk alone**. Walk in groups whenever you can – there is safety in numbers.
- Avoid carrying large sums of cash or displaying expensive jewelry in public.
- Let a family member or friend know your destination and your estimated time of arrival or return. That way, the police can be notified as quickly as possible if there is a problem.
- Wherever you are – on the street, in an office building or shopping mall, driving, waiting for a bus or subway – stay alert and tuned in to your surroundings.
- Send the message that you’re calm, confident, and know where you’re going.
- Do not go to the ATM at night. If there is no other alternative use machines in well lit areas and bring someone with you.
- Trust your instincts. If something or someone makes you uneasy, avoid the situation or person and leave.
- Choose busy streets and stay in well-lit areas as much as possible. Avoid alleys, vacant lots, wooded areas, and other short-cuts or secluded areas. They are usually not well-lit or heavily traveled. At night, stick to **well-lighted** areas only!
- Walk on the sidewalk whenever possible. Walk close to the curb, avoiding doorways, bushes, and other potential hiding places.
- Get to know the neighborhoods where you live and work. Find out what stores are open late and where the police and fire stations are located.
- If someone tries to rob you, don’t resist. Give up your property don’t give up your life.
- Report the crime to the police. Try to describe the attacker accurately. Your actions can help prevent others from becoming victims.
- Don’t overload yourself with packages, and avoid wearing shoes or clothing that restricts your movement.
- Carry a whistle or other sound device with you in case of emergency. The piercing, distinctive blast of a whistle can scare away possible attackers and alert others in the area that could come to your aid.
